In January 2019, something very extraordinary happened: for the first time, the title of the European Capital of Culture was awarded not to a city but to an entire region. Twenty-three municipalities, spread across two federal states, with approximately 110,000 residents, jointly applied for it.

The Salzkammergut, located in the heart of one of the most beautiful areas in Europe, is a truly special region that, for 7,000 years, has produced remarkable achievements through intellectuality. It attracted people from all parts of Europe due to the world's oldest salt mining. They came to work, live, and learn, and later, for recreation and inspiration.

Artists such as Gustav Mahler, Arnold Schönberg, Jakob Wassermann, Gustav Klimt, the Wittgenstein family, Oscar Straus, Hugo von Hofmannsthal, Stefan Zweig, Sigmund Freud, or Anton Bruckner, to name a few, lived and worked here.

This region has always been a "Capital of Culture," and its residents have consistently used diverse external influences to recognize their strengths and weaknesses, uniting tradition and modernity in a steadily growing selfconcept.

That the many municipalities and communities have always succeeded in preserving their very individual traditions and characteristics speaks - in the best sense of the term - for their independence, and self-will. It hasn't always been easy for the team and I, and for all those involved in program development, but today I can say that the many hours of collective effort have paid off. The European Capital of Culture year will be inaugurated the day after tomorrow with a program this region can be truly proud of: around 300 projects spread across 23 municipalities, featuring regional, national, and international creatives and artists in music, performing arts, architecture, craftsmanship, ecology, literature, and science.

We developed this program for and with the residents of this region. The significant creative potential we encountered will fill more than eight out of ten upcoming events with life and local connections.

Contrasting local resources with foreign perspectives is not only in line with the tradition of this cultural landscape, but it also aligns with the central purpose of art. Art does not develop in an ivory tower and does not serve solely for self-presentation. It aims to describe society as a whole, highlighting commonalities and differences, establishing relationships, and creating spaces for dialogue.

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This has been and remains the central mission drafted by the Greek Minister of Culture, Melina Mercouri, and her French counterpart, Jack Lang, at the founding of this European initiative. It must remain our concern to connect the diversity of European cultures and thereby strengthen the true foundation of this continent.

The exceptional setting in which we are allowed to make this happen has, of course, presented us with extraordinary challenges. Unlike large cities, there are no multifunctional venues, no major museums in this rural alpine region, and public transportation is in need of improvement, with staff shortages being a problem.

However, it was precisely these peculiarities and apparent deficiencies that allowed us to achieve all that we have. Because a European Capital of Culture is not an event in the conventional sense. It is not a festival. What artists and curators will contribute here is intended to entertain, stimulate, and bring joy, but it will be much more than fleeting pleasure.

This Capital of Culture is the beginning of a process. A process that starts with self-discovery and aims to lead towards a self-determined future. What this Capital of Culture does is showcase the existing qualities and potentials of this very special region, promote them, and use them as impulses for the ongoing development of this area.

In the name of my team and the representatives and residents of these 23 municipalities, I take the liberty to say that we are convinced that art and culture are the most powerful instruments for this kind of societal formation.

Art sharpens our perception, enables differentiated awareness, uplifts and delights us, but also holds up a mirror, critiques, and makes us question what the future can look like and what role we want to play in it. It shapes our aesthetic and, therefore, societal capital: "aisthesis" comes from the Greek, meaning "perceiving and sensually recognizing.

This European Capital of Culture will not leave monumental structures behind, but it will build bridges to the future. A future where:

- The past is no longer seen as a burden to be best forgotten but as the cornerstone for a careful and forward-looking approach to the present and future.
- Tourism is no longer an overwhelming one-way street with seasonally induced peak times but a mutual enrichment and an opportunity to learn from each other.
- All people who wish to be here do not have to leave but can live here and still participate in shaping a globally interconnected world.
- Culture preserves customs and traditions while drawing strength and inspiration from new influences to be prepared for challenges and to shape the future together.

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In this sense, we want to show that a Europe of strong rural regions is a space for the future. A lung that we need for breathing, which, through careful handling of cultural and ecological resources, is just as important as urban space. The Salzkammergut can be an exemplary and model region for Europe and perhaps beyond.

It doesn't always require enormous financial resources and monumental stages. All that it takes is faith in and the knowledge of the power of creativity, and the willingness to let people express their inherent creative potential.

What I am hoping for in the future: that this year of the European Capital of Culture is understood as a lived wake-up call. An appeal to the political authorities in this country, in Europe, and ultimately worldwide, to promote the power of culture to an even greater extent than before, recognizing its societal shaping factor.

This is our best and perhaps last chance to counterbalance the currently experienced loss of civilizational, democratic, and emancipatory values and to make this world a livable place for all. We only have this one world!

The team of the European Capital of Culture and I wish you many inspiring and enlightening moments in this special year.

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Facts

The title "European Capital of Culture" has been awarded to cities and regions in Europe since 1985. For the first time in history, it will be held in 2024 in an inner-alpine, rural region.

Bad Ischl and the Salzkammergut were awarded the title "European Capital of Culture 2024" in November 2019 after a multi-stage application process. The banner city of Bad Ischl, together with 22 other municipalities in Upper Austria and Styria, is developing a cultural region that reinvents itself through the interaction of art, culture, economy, and tourism. Together with Bad Ischl Salzkammergut, Tartu (Estonia) and Bodø (Norway) will host the European Capital of Culture 2024.

There are approximately 190 confirmed projects, with more than 85% being implemented by local and regional project organizers such as artists, associations, institutions, and businesses. Over 100 associated projects, which are carried out by external institutions or individuals and align with the programme lines of the European Capital of Culture Bad Ischl Salzkammergut 2024, will be communicated and integrated into the general programme schedule by the Capital of Culture 2024. Associated projects are not limited to the 23 Capital of Culture municipalities. They have an impact beyond the region and are particularly worthy of support due to their thematic focus and public impact.

The Supervisory Board, consisting of 14 members, was constituted in August 2020, with Hannes Heide as the Chairman. There are a total of nine owners of the European Capital of Culture Bad Ischl Salzkammergut 2024 GmbH, who also form the General Assembly: City of Bad Ischl / City of Gmunden / Regional Development Association Traunsteinregion / Regional Development Association InneresSalzkammergut-REGIS/RegionalAssociationAusseerland/ Tourism Association Bad Ischl / Tourism Association Inneres Salzkammergut / Cultural Vision Salzkammergut / Chamber of Commerce Upper Austria

The Regional Forum, established in October 2020, serves as an advisory body. Its 30 members provide advisory support, gather information from the region through their network, and act as a spokesperson for the concerns of the Capital of Culture Bad Ischl Salzkammergut 2024 GmbH.

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Prologue

To kick off the opening of the European Capital of Culture Bad Ischl Salzkammergut 2024, the *Artist in Residency Program* and the project *CURATING SPACE* present themselves. The exhibition features sculptures by Angelika Loderer and Markus Zeber, paintings by Linus Barta, and a photograph by Mira Klug. Franz Xaver Baier will deliver a performance speech on the topic of vacancy and space.

The starting point for the *CURATING SPACE* project is the search for potential vacant properties for use in events in the fields of visual and performing arts in the Salzkammergut region. The research, which began in 2022, led to a spatial research project on the topic of vacancy.

Franz Xaver Baier (*1953 in Passau)) Phenomenologist, author, and professor of architecture (Art + Design Research) at the University of Munich. He studied architecture, art history, and philosophy at the university. Engaged in the philosophy of phenomenology, existentialism, and philosophically poetic ways of life. Franz Xaver Baier addresses the phenomenon of "living space: where we live" with scientific and artistic methods. Since 1998, he has been a professor of Art + Design Research at the Faculty of Architecture of the University of Munich. He lives and works in Munich.

Linus Barta (*1987 in Bregenz), studied at the Faculty of Philosophy at the University. From 2014 to 2018, he studied at the Academy of Fine Arts Vienna in the class of Daniel Richter and Marina Grzinic. In 2018, he studied at the Academy of Fine Arts Leipzig (HGB) in the class of painting and graphics. Since fall 2022, he has curated the showroom of the Kosmos Atelier Bregenz. He lives and works in Vienna and Bregenz.

Mira Klug (*1992 in Graz) Attended Ortweinschule Graz and studied photography at the University of Applied Arts, Vienna. She examines the dispositif of photography for the possibilities of an altered representation of reality, where the artist manipulates the image content. In her series, she refers to organic elements that are detached from their original context and brought into new contexts of meaning, often appearing in multiple ways in individual image formations. She lives and works in Vienna.

Angelika Loderer (*1984 in Feldbach, Styria). Graduate of the University of Applied Arts Vienna (class of Erwin Wurm) and Wimbledon College of Art, London. She has developed a sculptural practice that translates the casting, scooping, layering, and pressing of various materials into free, abstract to non-representational forms. Starting from the observation of nature and the joy of material, her models are created from silicone and plaster, negative forms that are poured with wax, equipped with casting channels, finally fired in the oven, and filled with molten bronze. She lives and works in Vienna.

Markus Zeber (*1979) Studied at the Technical University of Vienna (1999-2005), Academy of Fine Arts in Krakow (2009-2010), and the University of Applied Arts in Vienna (2006-2011). Has been teaching at the University of Applied Arts Vienna since 2017 and at the University of Art in Linz since 2019. Resides in Vienna.

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Ornaments – Lines, spirals, zigzag patterns, stars, hearts, or vines play a central role in the design of everyday objects in the folk culture of the Salzkammergut. For centuries, they have been used, passed down, and reinterpreted regionally. 23 everyday objects from 23 municipalities of the Cultural Capital form the starting point of the exhibition and serve as an inspiration for 23 unique plates created by the painters of Gmunden. Kim Simonsson (*1974 in Finnland) Sculptor. He transports the viewers into an imaginative, fairy-tale world inspired by the forests of his homeland Finland, folklore, the idea of the apocalypse, and the atmospheric hum of contemporary life. Known for his life-sized Moss People made of ceramics – enchanting figures, mostly children. The Moss People, selected by The Art Newspaper as one of the six captivating discoveries at Design Miami/Basel 2021, are the result of a unique technique combining earthenware, paint, and nylon fibers, giving the figures their soft and mossy texture. Lives and works in Fiskars, Finland.

Elmar Trenkwalder (*1959 in Weißenbach am Lech) Studied under Max Weiler and Arnulf Rainer at the Academy of Fine Arts in Vienna. Since 1986, alongside his primary medium of drawing, he has turned to the medium of ceramics. Today, he conceives works of incredibly large scale. His sculptures display vertical verve with plant and sexualized forms ranging from ornamental systems to living and inanimate objects. They are characterized by physical and dynamic movement, reaching architectural breadth. Exhibitions in Austria and abroad (Frankfurt/M., Leipzig, Venice Biennale, Zurich, Vienna, Paris, etc.). Lives and works in Innsbruck.

Wirtshauslabor Salzkammergut 2024. The culinary laboratory of the 4th HLa of the Tourism School Bad Ischl and **Christoph "Krauli" Held** (Siriuskogl) (AT) revives the vacant former restaurant at the Bad Ischl train station with a fresh gastronomic concept. The laboratory provides a playing field for top chefs, ambitious apprentices, and artists to invigorate traditional regional gastronomy with new culinary art and innovative concepts. The European Capital of Culture sets an impulse to revive the disappearing country inn culture. Theme discussions are initiated with representatives from local and European top gastronomy, as well as art and culture. In addition, innkeepers are brought to life, and inn laboratories are convened in tourism and vocational schools.

Specially developed for the European Capital of Culture, the performative cooking collective **Healthy Boy Band** (Lukas Mraz, Philip Rachinger, Felix Schellhorn) in cooperation with friendship is presents the "HOT BOX BUILDING", a mobile installation that functions through culinary interventions and performances at various locations, activating them for a certain period: in the town center next to abandoned inns, by the lake in front of the picturesque mountain panorama, in the field directly with the producers, or in the abandoned industrial hall as an ambassador for the cause.

Christoph "Krauli" Held (*1985), residing in Bad Goisern, Chef & Gastronom. Krauli has been an independent gastronomer and head chef at the beautiful Siriuskogl in Bad Ischl for 16 years. His creativity and passion for fresh, authentic, and above all, cosmopolitan cuisine are contagious. His hallmark is the simple, unconventional, but above all, devoted way of cooking. In both professional and private life, he is known as a kitchen rebel, loving stubborn head, and visionary. Krauli is well-known from many German-speaking television shows, with or without a culinary focus.

Healthy Boy Band "Fuck Fine Dining". The trio, formed after the Gelinaz! event at Mühltalhof, is sometimes referred to as the "oddest cooking collective of all time." "We realized how flat and one-dimensional the discourse about good food and the importance of gastronomy often runs for us - and how much fun it would be for us to deal with other things, not just what's on the plate," Felix Schellhorn is quoted in an interview with the newspaper Der Standard.

Rachinger, Mraz und Schellhorn have made it their mission to creatively explore the boundaries between art, culinary, and cooking. According to their manifesto, they stand for a new gastronomic mindset, consider improvisation as a core competency, negotiate themes such as breaking traditions, diversity, and craftsmanship with their actions, and combine cooking events with artistic performances and socio-political issues.

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The Traunsee Tram, serving as both an urban transport and a regional train, connects people with Cultural Capital locations, history, tradition, and modernity. "How Much Weight Can a Boat Carry? / Can a Boat Carry Its Own Weight?" Starting from these questions, students from the University of Applied Arts Vienna, under the guidance of Hans Schabus (AT), Olga Mathilde Gärtner (AT), Luīze Nežberte (LV), Magdalena Stückler (AT), and Janina Weißengruber (AT), create an installation that explores the themes of sculpture and space.

Hans Schabus (*1970 in Watschig, municipality of Hermagor-Pressegger See in Carinthia) is a contemporary artist. He studied sculpture at the Academy of Fine Arts Vienna under Bruno Gironcoli. Since 2014, Hans Schabus has been teaching the class "Sculpture and Spatial Art" at the University of Applied Arts Vienna. Schabus gained recognition for designing the Austrian Pavilion at the 40th Biennale di Venezia in 2005 (commissioner Max Hollein). His sculptures and installations often reveal the relationship between the viewer and the space, either through monumental gestures or architectural interventions, closely tied to the place for which they are created. Prior to his works, he engages with the conditions and history of the specific location or material. A recurring motif in his works is passageways and entrance situations. He lives and works in Vienna.



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The area of the old gasworks becomes a temporary workplace for students, transforming Gmunden into a university town. With *PLATEAU BLO*, a floating island structure made up of several platforms moves across Lake Traunsee. It expands the landscape and backdrop with thoughts, space, and area, visible from the shore but not entirely easy to reach. A place of desire emerges, distinctly different from the usual tourist attractions. *PLATEAU BLO* unsettles the body and mind, induces a slight dizziness, stimulates reflection, and brings topics to the surface. Instead of static lake images, a living picture, a floating tableau vivant, is created

Simone Barlian (*1983 in Gmunden) Anchoring her scope of action at the intersections between art and interdisciplinary work, she is particularly fascinated by spatial theory. Both the creative process itself and the interaction and resonance of theme, object, space, and human always take center stage for her. As an artist and curator, she is particularly interested in the transformative and socio-political interplay within/through artistic events. Exhibitions as both an artist and curator in Linz, Vienna, Gmunden, Estonia. Curator at OÖ Kunstverein collective raumarbeiterinnen.

Sabine Pollak (*1960 in Graz) Architect, lecturer, researcher, and author. Professor for raum&designstrategien at the University of Art and Design Linz and runs the architectural firm Köb&Pollak Architektur in Vienna with Roland Köb. Habilitation for the subject of residential construction at TU Vienna. Sabine Pollak works theoretically (books, essays, an ongoing urbanism blog in Der Standard), teaches experimental architecture, the history of residential construction, and architectural theory, and researches topics such as housing and feminism, community and urbanism. She also works with her office as an expert in communal housing construction in Vienna.

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For the four-part *Salzkammer(sc)hall* project, the Salzkammergut serves as both the geographical and cultural starting point, material, content, and stage simultaneously. *DER GLÖGGLWAGGON* is a railway carriage equipped with bells and chimes, whose ringing is driven by the wind during its journey. The faster the ride, the more intensively it jingles, traversing the Salzkammergut from Attnang-Puchheim to Stainach-Irdning with a Doppler effect. When it is stationary, it is silent, and the church bells respond to the ,heathen noise'.

The sound-land-art project *Salzkammer(sc)hall* comprises four sonorous elements, which are also laden with clichés, pointing towards the future based on the familiar. Through sensory experience, an unfamiliar perspective on the familiar is intended. The four parts, to be realized at additional dates in June, September, and October 2024 and at different locations, include: *DER GLÖGGL-WAGGON* – Kinetic Sound Sculpture on Rails, DER LANGSAME SCHUSS – A temporary acoustic relief of the entire Salzkammergut with hundreds of shots, DER GESUNGENE HORIZONT – Choirs, DIE LANDSCHAFTSORGEL – Brass bands.

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



Unveiling SOLANGE #29 in the presence of the artist

The installation SOLANGE by **Katharina Cibulka** (AT) is an artwork designed for dialogue. Stitched on large-scale dust covers with cable ties and pink tulle in cross-stitch, it is mounted on a scaffolding, veiling the eastern facade of the Post Office Building in Bad Ischl. In her works, Katharina Cibulka pursues a consistent political agenda centered around aspects such as feminism, social justice, community, and questions related to aesthetic processes and the role of art itself. She often draws inspiration from stories and motifs that reflect fundamental societal issues and demands in a personal way. Her works take various forms in exploring emancipatory and social perspectives: interventions in public space, works involving film, photography, texts, or sound, along with actions and performances.

Katharina Cibulka and her team have been manually installing embroidered scaffolding nets at well-frequented, prominent construction sites since 2018, encouraging passersby to engage in discussions about socio-political messages. A sentence starting with "As long as" and ending with "I am a feminist" points to existing inequalities. The text is read by Katharina Cibulka.

As part of the installation *SOLANGE* #29 by Katharina Cibulka, which will be unveiled on Sat 20/01 at 12:30 pm during the opening of the European Capital of Culture 2024.

Katharina Cibulka (*1975 in Innsbruck) pursued studies in Media and Performance Art at the Academy of Fine Arts Vienna, School of Artistic Photography Vienna, International College SAE (digital film producer), and the New York Film Academy. She is a co-founder of the women's band telenovela and the artist group peek a corner. Cibulka works as an artist, filmmaker, photographer, and project developer & director for artistic and sustainable processes. Since 2021, she has been teaching at the Institute for Space and Design Strategies at the University of Art and Design Linz. Her works have been showcased worldwide in exhibitions and UF Film festivals, including Glucksman Gallery/Cork, Künstlerhaus/Wien, St. Claude Gallery/New Orleans, Kunstverein/Bonn, Shedhalle/Zürich, Secession/Wien, Neue Galerie/Innsbruck, Lidget Gallery/Budapest, Golden Thread Gallery/Belfast, Museum of Applied Arts/Belgrade, as well as at the St. Petersburg Biennale 2006, the International Student Triennale in Istanbul 2010, the 1st Rabat Biennale for Contemporary Art 2019, and Biennale d'Art et d'Architecture du Frac Centre-Val de Loire à Vierzon 2022. She has been awarded numerous prizes. Cibulka lives and works in Innsbruck and Vienna.

Opening Maruša Sagadin. Luv Birds in toten Winkeln

Maruša Sagadin (SI) explores the intersection of private and public space, bringing together elements from architecture, sculpture, and painting. Her work delves into the social aspects underlying a building or location. Central to her aesthetic exploration is the translation of architectural notions into three-dimensional artworks. Often, she comments on social and political focal points related to construction methods, location, design, users, and clients. Sagadin sheds light on gender, linguistic, and cultural connotations while challenging the traditional norms and structures of architecture. Employing various techniques such as enlargement, exaggeration, alienation, or repurposing everyday objects, she uses unconventional color combinations. While wood is her primary material, she also incorporates traditional building materials like concrete, cardboard, plaster, or styrofoam. Overpainting is another technique, altering the appearance of materials by applying thick layers of paint to make the underlying material disappear, giving her works a distinctive cartoon character.

Maruša Sagadin (*1978 in Ljubljana) is a Slovenian-Austrian visual artist. She studied architecture at the Technical University in Graz (1997-2004) and pursued studies in performative art and sculpture under Monica Bonvicini at the Academy of Fine Arts Vienna (2005-2010). Following two extended study periods in the United States – the MAK-Schindler Fellowship program in the Mackey Apartments, Los Angeles, in 2009/2010, and the International Studio and Curatorial Program (ISCP), New York, in 2015/2016 – she worked as a university assistant at the Academy of Fine Arts Vienna from 2012 to 2017. Since 2023, she has been a guest professor at the Academy of Fine Arts Prague. Maruša Sagadin has been exhibiting her works since 2008, with solo and joint presentations including:

Opening sudhaus - kunst mit salz & wasser

"It was called the white gold": Salt shaped the entire Salzkammergut region, remaining an important commodity today that led some to prosperity and others to wealth. Water and wood are also determining factors; without them, salt extraction would not be possible. However, salt and water are also vital for our bodies. Our organism consists of 65% water and requires a daily ration of at least five grams of salt. Finally: Salt and water are actually enemies that devour and dissolve each other, condemned to exist symbiotically until perhaps separated again in a brewing house. The central art exhibition of the European Capital of Culture 2024, curated by Gottfried Hattinger, metaphorically dedicates itself to these elements as the "salt of life." With international and cross-regional participation of renowned artists, it presents a broad spectrum of themes in the form of objects, sculptures, installations, film, photo, and sound works. Additionally, the artists engage with the burning issues of dwindling glaciers and the increasing water scarcity worldwide. Featuring Motoi Yamamoto (JP), Sigalit Landau (IL), Simon Starling (GB), Christine Biehler (DE), Michael Sailstorfer (DE), Lucy + Jorge Orta (GB/AR), Kati Roover (FI).

Gottfried Hattinger (*1950 in Geboltskirchen) is an artist and exhibition curator. He grew up in Traun, Austria. Hattinger graduated from the Art School Linz and was appointed as a graphic designer by Horst Stadlmayr at the Brucknerhaus Linz. From 1987 to 1991, he served as the artistic director of the Ars Electronica Festival. Since then, he has worked as a freelance curator and book designer. Hattinger has directed various events, including the theater festival Spielart and the Festival der Regionen from 2011 to 2017. He is married to pianist Suyang Kim and resides in Ottensheim.

Hicham Berrada (*1986 in Casablanca / Marokko). combines both artistic and scientific backgrounds in his work, merging intuition and knowledge, science and poetry. His guiding principle is to create forms, to bring them into existence, rather than merely representing them. - His works have been featured in numerous solo and group exhibitions, including at the Centre Pompidou and Palais de Tokyo in Paris, MoMA PS1 in New York, ICAS-Institute of Contemporary Art in Singapore, and Moderna Museet in Stockholm. He lives and works in Paris and Roubaix.

Christine Biehler (*1964 in Landau/Pfalz) is a visual artist, art educator, and project organizer. She studied Fine Arts in Mainz, Berlin, and at the HBK Braunschweig. Engaging in exhibitions since 1991, both nationally and internationally, including cities such as Madrid, Lucerne, Luxembourg, Linz, Dessau, Berlin, Nuremberg, and Cologne. As a professor, she has conducted research and teaching on sculpture, public art, and performance art at the universities of Dortmund and Hildesheim, as well as at the Kunsthochschule Kassel.

Sigalit Landau (*1969 in Jerusalem) is an interdisciplinary artist working with installation, video, photography, and sculpture. She completed her studies at the Bezalel Academy of Art and Design in Jerusalem in 1994. Radenko Milak (*1980 in Travnik) developed the multidisciplinary project "University of Disaster" for his solo exhibition at the Pavilion of Bosnia and Herzegovina during the 57th Venice Biennale in 2017. In 2019, his works were featured in the major exhibition "HYPER! A JOURNEY INTO ART AND MUSIC" at the Deichtorhallen Hamburg. In 2020, he had a solo exhibition titled "Desaster of the Unseen" at the Museum of Contemporary Art in Zagreb. During the same year, Marta Herford showcased a selection of his works in the exhibition "Trügerische Bilder – Ein Spiel mit Malerei und Fotografie." Simon Starling (*1967 in Epsom / UK) studied at the Glasgow School of Art and is considered one of the leading artists of his generation. In his multimedia work, he engages with scientific discoveries as well as global economic and ecological issues. He represented Scotland at the 50th Biennale di Venezia (2003) and was awarded the Turner Prize in 2005. From 2003 to 2013, he served as a professor of fine arts at the Städelschule in Frankfurt. Starling's works have been featured in solo exhibitions worldwide, including at the Museum für Gegenwartskunst in Basel, Mass MOCA in North Adams, USA, Tate Britain in London, Stuttgarter Staatsgalerie, and MUMA in Melbourne. His works are held in internationally significant collections. Starling currently lives in Glasgow and Copenhagen.

Anna Rún Tryggvadóttir (*1980 in Iceland) is a visual artist working with kinetic sculptural installations, material performances, as well as watercolor, drawing, and film. She creates situations that foster and challenge mutual relationships. Her works have been featured in group exhibitions at institutions such as the Kunstmuseum Reykjavík, Nordic House in Reykjavik, UNAM Mexico City, Disko Arts Festival in Greenland, and Cycle Music & Arts Festival in Berlin. Eröffnung Ballet Mécanique

In 2019, visual artist Peter Kogler and curator Katrin Bucher-Trantow initiated a reinterpretation of the legendary Ballet Mécanique by American composer George Antheil for Kogler's exhibition Connected at Kunsthaus Graz. Graz-based composer Winfried Ritsch subsequently realized this music machine. At the height of the industrial revolution in the 1920s, George Antheil fascinated audiences with the idea of having his Ballet Mécanique performed by a machine orchestra. Eight drums, seven bells, a siren, seven airplane propellers, and up to 16 Pianolas, widely used player pianos at the time, were intended to bring this to life, but he failed in the technical execution. Ultimately, an alternative version with two pianists and a Pianola at a slower tempo was shown in the first performance in Paris, provoking a highly notable scandal. A year later, the performance in the USA led to a fiasco. However, his idea lives on and continues to captivate artists and audiences alike. One hundred years after the creation of Ballet Mécanique, it will now be performed in the originally intended version by Antheil, synchronously with the version of the eponymous film by Fernand Léger from 1924, at Lehártheater. The era of avant-garde is being prescribed indefinitely! The premiere of this film and piano installation took place in 2019 at Kunsthaus Graz.

Georg Johann Carl Antheil (*1900 in Trenton, New Jersey; † 1959 in New York). UU.S. composer and pianist, son of German immigrants. Studied music theory and composition with Constantin von Sternberg in Philadelphia and Ernest Bloch in New York. Piano studies with George Frederick Boyle at the Curtis Settlement School. In 1922, he received a scholarship in Berlin, launching a career as a pianist performing his own and contemporary works. Later, he focused on composition. His pieces were percussive, dissonant, and strongly rhythmic. In 1923, he moved to Paris, where he associated with artists such as Erik Satie, Jean Cocteau, Ernest Hemingway, James Joyce, Ezra Pound, Pablo Picasso, and Olga Rudge. In 1924, Antheil, together with Fernand Léger and Dudley Murphy, began the Ballet Mécanique project. Léger and Murphy created one of the first abstract films, accompanied by Antheil's music played by sixteen player pianos. The Paris premiere under Vladimir Golschmann in 1926 was considered a (scandalous) success. However, the performance in New York City in 1927 under Eugène Goossens became one of the biggest disasters remembered in New York. Ballet Mécanique remains George Antheil's most famous composition.

Fernand Léger (*1881 in Argentan, Normandy; † 1955 in Gif-sur-Yvette bei Paris) was a painter, sculptor, graphic artist, ceramicist, and film director. His early work is associated with Cubism. In his post-World War II works, his painterly style evolved. From the 1920s onward, he increasingly incorporated figurative elements into his paintings. Léger's late work influenced American Pop Art painters such as Roy Lichtenstein. After working for several years as an architectural draftsman, Fernand Léger moved to Paris around 1900, attending courses at the École des Arts Décoratifs and the Académie Julian. He joined the loosely organized Puteaux group, affiliated with Cubism; among the Cubists, he was particularly influenced by Picasso and Georges Braque. In 1908, he opened a studio in the Parisian artists' colony La Ruche, along with Henri Laurens, Marc Chagall,

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Guillaume Apollinaire, and others. Inspired by war machinery, he directed the experimental film Le Ballet Mécanique in 1924. During World War II, Léger emigrated to the United States and returned to Paris in 1945. He received the Painter's Prize at the São Paulo Biennale in 1955. His works were posthumously presented at documenta I, II, and III.

Winfried Ritsch (*1964 in Innsbruck) is a composer and developer of free software and hardware in the field of computer music. He engages in various artistic activities such as radio art, performances, installations, sound sculptures, telematic art projects (networks), concerts, and compositions. He studied electrical engineering at the Technical University of Graz and composition at the University of Music and Performing Arts Graz under Andrzej Dobrowolski. Ritsch holds a teaching qualification as a university lecturer with artistic-scientific suitability at the University of Music and Performing Arts Graz and later became an assistant at the Institute of Electronic Music and Acoustics (IEM) in Graz. In 1998, he founded the Netzkultur initiative, which he led until 2009. Since 2000, he has held an extraordinary professorship. From 2001 to 2003, Ritsch was a member of the Media Advisory Board of the Austrian Federal Chancellery for Art and Culture. Since 2004, he has been a member of the Cultural Advisory Board of the City of Graz. His awards include the Förderungspreis der Stadt Graz für Komposition, Artist in Residence at the Banff Centre for Arts (Canada), Artist in Residence at Ars Electronica in Linz, Max Brand Prize of the City of Vienna (for electroacoustic composition), and the Andrzej Dobrowolski Composition Prize of the State of Styria.

The *Music Machine* combines regional instrument characteristics with electronic music techniques. Visitors can control a sort of music robot through an interface, merging traditional zither and dulcimer sounds and their materiality with modern electronic beats. This results in miniature compositions that bridge the gap between tradition and innovation, appealing to both experienced enthusiasts and the curious. For the opening on 20 January, 2024, musicians will explore the spectrum of possibilities offered by this music machine.

Opening Performance Regional_Express.

The *Regional_Express* – a travel experience on rail and in VR – is an acoustically-visual immersive narrative on the train route from Gmunden to Bad Aussee, focusing on the cultural and natural heritage of the region. During the train journey, an immersive experience for a curated application (e.g., Pocket Guide) and for Virtual Reality (360/AR) is created through a time and memory journey. Ella Raidel (AT) developed the narrative with the local population. Like memory itself, it consists of fragments that draw from facts and fictions, allowing new perspectives through its performative character. The stories expand beyond the personal and shift the perspective to nature as a narrator, the glacier impacted by climate change, the transformations of rocks that encapsulate contemporary human history.

Various protagonists take their seats on the train during the journey, new encounters occur, and audio-visual landscapes expand memory and imagination. The dramaturgy is based on the parameters of the train as a stage and a limited space, the route as a temporal axis, the travel speed, and the stops as indicators for a sensory experience. The project was developed in several medial stages, always intertwined and communicated to the public.

FLOOD is a dynamic projection mapping onto the Johann Nestroy school building, adapted specifically by media artists Ruth Schnell (AT) and Martin Kusch (AT). The facade of the building becomes part of a spectacular animation, with its visual foundation being the text of the 1948 International Bill of Rights. The effects of climate change and environmental destruction are pushing people worldwide, especially from the Global South, into increasingly precarious living conditions. For example, the right to access clean water was recognized as a human right by the UN General Assembly in 2010.

Ruth Schnell (*1956 in Feldkirch) lives and works in Vienna. The media artist has been teaching at the University of Applied Arts Vienna since 1987 and has been leading the Digital Art class for 12 years. Her artistic work includes Media Environments, interactive Mixed Media works, robotics, public art, video sculptures, light objects, photography, and video. She lives and works in Vienna.

Martin Kusch (*1964 in Austria) directs the digital performance group kondition pluriel, Montreal, and the Fulldome VR/AR Lab at the University of Applied Arts in Vienna, where he is an associate professor. His practice focuses on medial, virtual, interactive, and performative installations and immersive environments. He lives and works in Vienna.

Eine Frau, die weiß, was sie will! (Operette in zwei Akten von Oscar Straus)

In a breathless tour de force, the consummate performers Dagmar Manzel and Max Hopp act and sing their way through 20 characters using power and slapstick. The glamour queen and operetta diva Manon Cavallini can turn the head of any man. The Jewish-Austrian composer Oscar Straus had his Woman Who Knows What She Wants! sing "Why shouldn't a woman have an affair" and with that, did not only compose a masterpiece that embodies the operetta style of the Weimar Republic, but also reflected the new image of women from that time - lascivious, fresh and bold. As one of the most successful composers of operettas in the 1920s and 1930s, he created, together with the librettist Alfred Grünwald, a touching piece that still, 100 years later, is a moving celebration of life and love – a brilliant guest performance by the Komische Oper Berlin that throws away all kinds of clichés about roles, fusillade of marches, waltzes, foxtrots and chansons from the pen of Oscar Straus.

Barrie Kosky (*1967 in Melbourne) is a German-Australian opera and theater director. From 2012/2013 until 2021/2022, he served as the artistic director and chief director of the Komische Oper Berlin. Under his leadership, the institution received multiple awards, including Opera House of the Year and the International Opera Award. He concluded his leadership role at the Komische Oper in the summer of 2022 but continues to work there as a guest director. He resides and works in Berlin.

Adam Benzwi (*1965 in San Diego) ist Dirigent, Pianist und von 1995 bis 2022 Honorarprofessor im Studiengang Musical/Show an der Universität der Künste Berlin. Aktuell zu sehen u.a. in *Fremder als der Mond*, Dreigroschenoper, *Ich hab die Nacht geträumet*, Berliner Ensemble, *Messeschlager Gisela*, Komische Oper Berlin, *Ein bisschen trallala*, Volksoper Wien.

Max Hopp (*1972 als Marcus Hopp in Ost-Berlin) is a German actor and director. Since 1995, he has participated in numerous theater productions and has appeared in over 70 film and television productions. He gained broader recognition on television from 2007 onwards for his role as the eccentric and duty-conscious police chief Mark Dononelli in the ZDF medical series "Doktor Martin." Hopp made his stage debut in reunited Germany in 1995 at the Bremer Theater in the operetta Anatevka. He had fixed engagements at venues such as the Schauspielhaus Hamburg (1996-2000), Schauspielhaus Zürich (2001-2005), Münchner Kammerspiele (2001-2003), and Deutsches Theater Berlin (2002). Since 2005, he has had engagements at the Volksbühne Berlin, Komische Oper Berlin, Bayerische Staatsoper, Deutsche Oper am Rhein Düsseldorf, Opernhaus Zürich, and has played roles in various German crime series since 1996. He has collaborated with directors such as Barbara Bilabel, Dimiter Gotscheff, Christoph Marthaler, Frank Castorf, Ronald Steckel, Ulrich Waller, Luk Perceval, Calixto Bieito, and Elke Lang. In 2016, he was nominated for the Friedrich-Luft-Preis for Eine Frau, die weiß, was sie will! (A Woman Who Knows What She Wants!)

Dagmar Manzel (*1958 in East Berlin) is a German actress, singer, and voice actress. In 1980, she received an engagement at the Staatstheater Dresden. From 1983 to 2001, she was a permanent ensemble member at the Deutsches Theater Berlin. During this time, she collaborated with directors such as Thomas Langhoff, Heiner Müller, Thomas Schulte-Michels, and Frank Castorf. In addition to her acting career, she frequently appears as a guest in musical theater productions. Since the 1980s, she has been regularly seen in film and television, including alongside Fabian Hinrichs in the second Tatort team of Bayerischer Rundfunk, investigating in Franconia as Chief Inspector Paula Ringelhahn. She has received numerous awards, including the Adolf-Grimme-Preis and the Bayerischer Fernsehpreis in 2004 for her role as Manja Grüneberg, a woman battling breast cancer, in Kai Wessel's television drama *Leben wäre schön* (Life Would Be Beautiful).

Oscar Straus (Oscar Nathan Strauss *1870 in Vienna; †January 11, 1954, in Bad Ischl) was an Austrian operetta composer. He is considered one of the most significant composers of the Silver Operetta Era, alongside Franz Lehár, Leo Fall, and Emmerich Kálmán. The son of Jewish banker Leopold Strauss, he later changed his surname to Straus to avoid confusion with the Strauss waltz dynasty. He composed numerous operettas, including *Ein Walzertraum* and *Eine Frau, die weiß, was sie will*. He also composed for Broadway and Hollywood and set poems to music. He served as a conductor in Brüx and Teplitz-Schönau. In Berlin, he was involved in the first German music cabaret, the Überbrettl, where the young Arnold Schönberg also worked for a period. After the annexation of Austria by Germany, he had to emigrate in 1939, first to Paris, then to New York and Hollywood. It was only after World War II that he returned to Europe. Straus is buried at the Bad Ischl cemetery.

Tom Neuwirth aka Conchita

Tom Neuwirth (AT) returns to the Salzkammergut with a moving performance. It was from here that he once set out to conquer the world overnight as **Conchita Wurst** at the Eurovision Song Contest, becoming an icon of the LGBTIQA* community**. Get ready for a moment full of emotions as he presents his songs in a minimalist version during the opening ceremony of the European Capital of Culture, showcasing his versatile voice in its full glory. (LGBTIQIA Community) (**Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Inter, Queer, Agender-Community)

Doris Uhlich. Pudertanz

Inspired by the legendary solo *Pudertanz* (Powder Dance) from 2010, **Doris Uhlich** (AT) designs a performance for the opening of the European Capital of Culture. The choreographer, born at Lake Attersee, and her ensemble stir up dust. Bodies dancing in powder clouds create waves, vibrate, make their fat dance, and celebrate physical diversity and individual beauty.

Modeschule Ebensee

There was rustling. There was folding, cutting, gluing. Unusual processing techniques were used for a very extraordinary collection, which the 5th-grade students applied to their handmade models. They created 12 complete outfits from paper inspired by the costumes of the Salzkammergut. Since September 2023, they have been working on the collection. Together with **Isa Stein** (AT), they explore themes such as habitation, physicality, paper in its multidimensionality, and "bringing materiality to life." There was an intensive design process. The young designers received professional support in implementing their designs in a workshop led by **Justine Masché** (DE) (Product Developer, Design Coordinator) from the **fashion label Andreas Kronthaler for Vivienne Westwood**, London. Thus, there were inputs from the pinnacle of the fashion world, which the students enthusiastically incorporated.

Hubert von Goisern (Hubert Achleitner) (*1952 in Bad Goisern) In 1987, he founded the Alpinkatzen and began deconstructing alpine folk music, earning the title of the inventor of "Alpenrock" or Alpine Rock. He has been involved in numerous musical projects, navigating the realms between world and folk music, tradition, and modernity. His tours and musical journeys have taken him across Europe, the USA, the Arab world, Tibet, and Africa. From 2007 to 2009, he toured with a concert ship from Linz on the Danube to the Black Sea and over the Rhine to the North Sea, featuring over 100 musicians from 12 countries. The Brenna tuats Tour in 2011 became one of the most successful in his career. In 2015, he appeared on the big screen with the biographical documentary film "Brenna tuat's schon lang," winning the Amadeus Austrian Music Award. In 2018, the Hubert von Goisern Cultural Award was established, and in May 2020, his first novel "Flüchtig" was published. His new studio album "Zeiten & Zeichen" was released on August 28, 2020. In 2022, Hubert von Goisern embarked on a new tour. In September 2021, his new music show "Steilklänge – Radio für Schwindelfreie," hosted by the musician himself, aired on Freien Radio Salzkammergut. In the spring of 2023, "Derweil 2" - a collection of the best songs from 2007 to 2023 - was released, along with a recording of the previous year's tour finale at the Salzburg Festival House: the double album "Zeiten & Zeichen Live." From May to November 2023, Hubert von Goisern and his band returned to the stages of Europe for the Neue Zeiten Alte Zeichen Tour.

Tom Neuwirth aka Conchita (*1988 in Gmunden) also known as Conchita, is an Austrian artist who introduced the persona Conchita Wurst in 2011. As the bearded diva, he won the Eurovision Song Contest in 2014, becoming an overnight global symbol for the LGBTIQ community. Subsequently, he released the platinum-certified debut album Conchita in 2015, the second album From Vienna With Love with the Vienna Symphony (2018), and the third studio album T.O.M. - Truth Over Magnitude (2019), featuring electro-pop under the new artist name WURST. Conchita WURST embarked on an orchestral tour, including a visit to Australia in early 2020. Serving as a host, Conchita WURST participated in events like the Life Ball, the opening of the Vienna Festival Weeks, and prominent TV music shows such as the Eurovision Song Contest and the Amadeus Austrian Music Awards. The artist is an advocate for socio-political causes, having been an Ambassador for EuroPride Vienna in 2019, a Stonewall Day Ambassador since 2018, and a supporter of the Free & Equal campaign by the United Nations.

Doris Uhlich (*1977 in Oberösterreich) Upper Austria) is a choreographer and dancer. She studied pedagogy for contemporary dance at the Conservatory of the City of Vienna. Since 2006, she has challenged conventional formats and body images through her productions. Working with individuals with diverse biographies and physical expressions, she questions the translatability of classical ballet into contemporary contexts. Uhlich opens the dance floor to people with physical disabilities, explores the potentials of nudity beyond simple eroticism and provocation, and examines the multifaceted relationship between humans and machines. She also engages with the future of the human body in the era of surgical and genetic enhancement. Uhlich delves into the representation of nudity beyond ideology and provocation, with music, especially electronic dance music from New Wave to Techno, playing a crucial role. Some of her notable works include SPITZE (2008), Come Back (2012), mehr als genug (2009), and more than naked (2013). She created Habitat, featuring a raving naked ensemble that performed in venues such as the Dominikanerkirche in Krems, the facade of the Vienna Secession, and the former Winterreithalle of the Austro-Hungarian Monarchy. For Ravemachine (2016), Uhlich, along with dancer Michael Turinsky, won the Nestroy Special Prize

Doris Uhlich has received numerous awards, honors, and nominations. She also works as a choreographer and Intimacy Coach for films, including Alma & Oskar by Dieter Berner (2023).

Ludger Engels (*1963 in Duisburg-Meiderich) serves as the director for the Opening Ceremony and is a professor, lecturer, and mentor in directing. Since 2022, he has been the Artistic Director and Managing Director of the Akademie für Darstellende Kunst Baden-Württemberg. From 2005 to 2013, he held the position of Chief Director and Deputy Artistic Director at the Theater Aachen. Engels has been a lecturer in opera and theater directing for several years at institutions such as the Hochschule für Musik Hanns Eisler in Berlin and the Toneelacademie Maastricht. As a director and musician, Ludger Engels has gained international recognition, particularly for his interdisciplinary and spatially expansive projects. His productions, projects, and installations range from the Baroque period to premieres and have been presented in theaters, opera houses, festivals, and museums in Munich, Berlin, Karlsruhe, Mannheim, Hannover, as well as in Switzerland, Hungary, the USA, Australia, and South Korea.

Susanna Fabian responsible for choir training for the Choir of 1000 during the Opening Ceremony, studied at PH-Linz, completed her diploma as a vocal coach at Bruckner University Linz, and received training in choral conducting. She is a teacher for singing and voice at the LMS Bad Goisern and LMS Ebensee, and also teaches choral singing, ensemble, and violin at MMS Gosau. Additionally, she works as an independent vocal coach and serves as a workshop leader for singing at AME (Austrian Music Education). Fabian is also the conductor of a mixed-voice choir named "Hodgepodge."

Anselm Fischer (*1981 in Linz) is a freelance lighting designer, known for his work at various venues, including the Salzburg Festival.

Tilman Kanitz responsible for sound design during the Opening Ceremony, is a musician, director, producer, and music curator. He studied music at the universities of Lübeck, Freiburg, and Cologne, completing his studies at the University of Southern California in Los Angeles with cellist Eleonore Schoenfeld and violinist Midori. Kanitz has served as a solo cellist at opera houses in Germany and Switzerland and is the artistic director of the Berlin music theater group Solistenensemble Kaleidoskop. He has experimented with innovations in performance practices and presentation, working with classical Western music, improvisation, and electronic music. Kanitz has been a guest at major international music, dance, and performance festivals, including Ruhrtriennale, Tanzplattform Deutschland, Donaueschingen Festival, Internationale Ferienkurse Darmstadt, Schleswig-Holstein Musik Festival, Tongyeong International Music Festival, Operadagen Rotterdam, and Wien Modern. He lives and works in Berlin.

Mamadou Diabaté plus Congarilla Rhythmic Enchanting Worlds The passion for percussion is at the core of the young Upper Austrian ensemble Congarilla. One of Congarilla's favorite guests is the West African balafon virtuoso Mamadou Diabaté. Born in Burkina Faso and now living in Vienna, Mamadou Diabaté was honored as the best musician of the year in his homeland in 2019.

Mamadou Diabaté comes from a traditional musician family of the Sambla people in Burkina Faso, West Africa. He received music lessons from his father Penegue Diabate, who was widely known as a balafon player beyond the borders of Sambla culture during his time. At the age of eight, he began training with renowned balafonists from neighboring communities, such as Daouda Diabate († 2018). He has been living in Vienna since 2000. Diabaté is the founder and leader of the group "Percussion Mania" since 2006 and the founder and chairman of the non-profit association Sababu, which has been operating an elementary school in Sababu, Bobo-Dioulasso (Burkina Faso) since 2010. Since 2016, he has been involved in a linguistic project by Laura McPherson at Dartmouth College (USA). He has performed worldwide at festivals such as Rudolstadt-Festival, Salzburg Festival, WOMAD, Glatt & Verkehrt, Africa Festival, and has released numerous albums.

Band Congarilla/Pepi Kramer (*in Rüstorf, Upper Austria) studied classical percussion at the Bruckner Conservatory in Linz. He served as a substitute in the State Theater in Linz and the Bruckner Orchestra. Since 1985, Pepi Kramer has been a music school teacher in Upper Austria. He has played in the Gustav Mahler Orchestra and since 1993 in the RSO Orchestra Vienna, performing at festivals such as the Salzburg Festival and Wien Modern. Kramer has a keen interest in various music cultures, particularly Latin America (in Amsterdam/at the University of Sao Paulo, in Rotterdam). In 1996, he played with the group *OLODUM* at the Carnival in Salvador (Bahia) and in the music video *They Don't Care About Us* by Michael Jackson. Pepi Kramer is the author of instructional books, co-editor of the Ethno-Percussion curriculum for the State Music School in Upper Austria, and the bandleader of *Congarilla*. Yasmo aka Yasmin Hafedh (*1990 in Vienna) is a rapper, slam poet, and author. She studied Theater, Film, and Media Studies at the University of Vienna. For the first time, the organist of Stadtpfarrkirche and renowned expert in contemporary organ literature, **Raminta Skurulsjkaite** (LT), collaborates with one of the great talents in modern percussion, **Emma Frauenholz** (AT). The musicians take the audience on an adventurous journey from Estonia to Russia and into contemporary Poland. The program includes Aleksandra Chmielewska's *Letter from Faraway Island* for organ and percussion, Arvo Pärt's *Trivium* for organ, Isaac Albeniz's *Asturias* (Arr. E. M. Frauenholz) for percussion, and Sofia Gubaidulina's *Detto* for organ and percussion.

Raminta Scurulskaite (* in Vilnius, Lithuania) studied music and organ at the Music and Theatre Academy in Vilnius and in Salzburg, specializing in organ concert performance and instrumental and vocal pedagogy. Since September 2023, she has been the cantor at the parish of St. Nicolai in Bad Ischl, leading the Chorus Nicolai and the parish orchestra, and organizing concerts, guest choirs, and church celebrations.

Aleksandra Chmielewska (*1993 in Warsaw) is a composer of the young generation and a writer. She studied composition at the Fryderyk Chopin University of Music in Warsaw and is currently a doctoral candidate, working on a dissertation about the life of Frida Kahlo. She is a candidate at the Karol Szymanowski Academy of Music in Katowice and the chairwoman of the Society of Young Composers in Poland.

Avo Pärt (*1935 in Paide, Estonia) is a composer and representative of the New Simplicity, and one of the most significant living composers of contemporary music. He became an Austrian citizen and lived in Berlin from 1981 to 2008. Pärt studied composition in Tallinn and at the Moscow Conservatory, developing a collage technique. His music drew disapproval from Soviet cultural officials due to its non-conformist modern compositional style and religious content. Pärt joined the Russian Orthodox Church in 1972 and explored Gregorian chant. With the piano piece "Für Alina," he presented his personal style, the so-called Tintinnabuli style, characterized by the reduction of musical material to the essential. Pärt emigrated to Vienna in 1980, and after the collapse of the Soviet Union, he returned to Estonia in 2008. In 2018, the Arvo Pärt Centre in Laulasmaa, Estonia, designed by Nieto Sobejano Arquitectos, was opened.

Isaac Albeniz (*1860 in Camprodon, Girona; † 1909 in Cambo-les-Bains, Département Pyrénées-Atlantiques, France). Spanish composer and pianist. Spending many years both in Spain and abroad (America, Cuba, Germany, France), he studied, among others, with Franz Liszt. Albéniz skillfully incorporated the rhythms of Spanish and Andalusian folk music into his piano works. He is considered the founder of the Spanish National style, blending folkloric elements with virtuosic piano writing, occasionally leaning towards salon-like genres. In 1902, he moved to Paris, where he completed his composition studies with Vincent d'Indy and Paul Dukas. During his time in Paris, he matured as a composer and developed his distinctive style. Sofia Gubaidulina (*1931 in Tschistopol, Tatarstan, Russia). Studied at the Conservatory of Kazan and received composition lessons from Nikolai Pejko in Moscow. Since 1963, she has been a freelance composer, strongly influenced by her Christian beliefs, with limited recognition in Russia. She co-founded the ensemble Astreja with Viktor Suslin and Vyacheslav Artyomov, which improvised on instruments of Russian folk music. In 1992, she moved to Germany, and the premiere of her 1st Violin Concerto marked her breakthrough. Gubaidulina is considered one of Russia's most significant contemporary composers. In 2000, she received a commission from the International Bach Academy Stuttgart for the Passion 2000 project, for which she wrote a St. John Passion, along with Tan Dun, Osvaldo Golijov, and Wolfgang Rihm. In 2002, she composed Johannes-Ostern. These two works juxtapose Evangelist texts with passages from the Apocalypse, dealing with the death and resurrection of Christ, making them her most extensive works to date. She dedicated her second Violin Concerto, In tempus praesens, to Anne-Sophie Mutter. In 2003, she became the first woman to be honored with a "Composer Portrait" at the Rheingau Music Festival. Gubaidulina holds the title of Honorary Professor at the Conservatory of Kazan, the Conservatories of Beijing and Tianjin. She is a member of various prestigious institutions, including the Freie Akademie der Künste Hamburg, the Order Pour le mérite, the Academy of Arts Berlin, the Royal Swedish Academy of Music Stockholm, and an honorary member of the American Academy of Arts and Letters. In 2018, she was appointed to the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences. She currently resides and works near Hamburg.

11 pm – 00 am Duo Ruut (EST)

Ann-Lisett Rebane (zither, vocals), Katariina Kivi (zither, vocals)

On stage stands the large Estonian zither. The two singers, Ann-Lisett Rebane (EST) and Katariina Kivi (EST), stand on either side, playing the zither together, delicately stroking, plucking, and percussively hammering. Accompanying their performance are two enchanting voices narrating tales of cows, meadows, and forests. Currently, Duo Ruut is one of the most sought-after ensembles at international world music festivals and serves as ambassadors for our sister European Capital of Culture, Tartu 2024.

Duo Ruut Their sound brings together a single Estonian zither and two distinct voices. Drawing inspiration from the traditions of their Estonian heritage, they incorporate beliefs from various cultures alongside their contemporary and emotionally driven songwriting. Composing on a single instrument, Duo Ruut's music is inherently minimalist yet brimming with new and imaginative ideas. In 2019, they released their debut album Tuule sõnad, which was awarded Debut Album of the Year at the Estonian Ethno Music Awards 2020 and nominated in various categories at the Estonian Music Awards 2021. In 2021, they released the EP Kulla Kerguseks I Goldenes Licht, earning a nomination for Ethno/Folk Album of the Year at the Estonian Music Awards 2022. In a short time, Duo Ruut has toured across Europe, Uzbekistan, and Japan, performing at festivals like Celtic Connections, ESNS, Womex, Trans Musicales, Tallinn Music Week, Sharq Taronalari, and Jazzkaar. They have collaborated with popular artists such as Curly Strings or NOËP. The remix of their song Tuule sõnad by NOËP was awarded Remix of the Year by Radio 2.

The first part of the diverse concert evening in the acoustically unique Evangelical Church of Bad Ischl is dedicated to the French Modern era, which left its mark well into the 20th century. The focal point is a Concertino by **Cécile Chaminade** (FR), whose talent was discovered by George Bizet in a challenging time for female musicians and composers.

Cécile Louise Stéphanie Chaminade (*1857 in Paris; †1944 in Monte Carlo) was a composer and pianist. Her initial attempts at composition date back to early childhood. At the age of 8, she played her own works for Georges Bizet, who was greatly impressed by her talent. At 18, she gave her first concert, and on May 3, 1877, she made her debut as a pianist in a piano trio by Charles-Marie Widor at the Salle Pleyel. From this time onwards, her compositional work gained increasing popularity. She left behind an extensive body of work, including around 200 pieces for solo piano and more than 100 songs. 1927: Messe pour deux voix égales, Op. 167, 1928: La Nef sacrée Recueil de Piècespour orgue ou harmonium, Op. 171 1882: La Sévillane, Komische Oper 1888: Callirhoë, Ballet Symphonique, Op. 37. Premiered on 16 March, 1888 in Marseille.

9 – 10 pm From a Persian Garden

Trio Gabbeh – Golnar Shahyar (IRN/AT) (vocals), Mona Matbou Riahi (IRN/AT) (clarinet), Manu Mayer (AT) (double bass)

The music of the Trio Gabbeh unfolds unexpectedly and sonorously like a meandering tale, much like the Gabbeh itself, a variation of the Persian carpet traditionally woven by nomadic women. Their music represents the intersection of two worlds, bridging Iran and Vienna, memories and interpretations of a life in a new homeland.

Ensemble Gabbeh Based in Vienna, this ensemble draws inspiration from the same concept. It picks up threads and brings them together. Its musical textures and forms develop from the open space of improvisation and are rooted in the vibrant diversity of traditional Iranian folklore. A multilayered fabric woven from remembered fragments of Persian children's songs, travel narratives, life stories, and their echoes in the Viennese diaspora. Two worlds, mirrored, shattered, and newly reassembled.

Our home continent is in intense motion, both at its edges and within its core. The Union of 27, awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 2012, is at a turning point in the face of political and climatic catastrophes. In the midst of this upheaval, can culture, education, poetry, and art contribute to a realignment of Europe's political, social, and humanitarian values?

Aleida Assmann (*1947 in Bethel) studied Anglistics and Egyptology at the Universities of Heidelberg and Tübingen and was a professor at the University of Konstanz from 1993-2014. Her research focuses on media cultural history, trauma, and memory studies. She and her husband Jan Assmann were awarded the Balzan Prize in 2017 for their research on Cultural Memory and the Peace Prize of the German Book Trade in 2018. Recent publications include *Forms of Forgetting* (2016), *Human Rights and Human Duties* (2018), *The European Dream* (2018), and *The Reinvention of the Nation* (2020).

Nava Ebrahimi (*Tehran in 1978) is an author and editor now residing in Graz, Austria. She studied journalism and economics in Cologne. Her second novel, Das Paradies meines Nachbarn, was published in 2020. She has received numerous awards for her works, including the Austrian Book Prize, the Morgenstern Prize for Sechzehn Wörter, the Rotahorn Prize and the Ingeborg Bachmann Prize.

Herfried Münkler (*1951 in Friedberg, Hessen), a political scientist, taught at the Humboldt University of Berlin until 2018. His dissertation on Machiavelli is considered a standard work, influencing his later works significantly. His notable publications include "The New Wars" (2002) and "Empires: The Logic of World Domination – from Ancient Rome to the United States" (2005). Münkler is also known for his contributions to sociological journals like the International Review of Sociology and Kölner Zeitschrift für Soziologie und Sozialpsychologie.

Fiston Mwanza Mujila a poet, writer, and curator, was born in Lubumbashi, Democratic Republic of the Congo. Since 2009, he has been residing in Graz, Austria. His works include performances and readings, often in collaboration with musicians, as well as poetry, prose, and plays. He also teaches African literature at the University of Graz. His novel Tram (2014) earned him awards such as the Grand Prix du Premier Roman and the International Literature Prize from the House of Cultures, as well as a nomination for the Man Booker International Prize.

Eva-Maria Voigtländer (*1958 in Hannover), the dramaturge, studied philosophy, theater science, and modern German literature in Berlin. Since 2000, she has been teaching at the Theater Academy Hamburg. In 2013, she briefly served as the chief dramaturge at Schauspiel Düsseldorf. Since 2015, she has been working as a dramaturge at the Burgtheater in Vienna, where she previously worked as an editor and juror.

His work has been featured in numerous solo and group exhibitions at venues such as Secession Vienna, Academy of Arts Berlin, Living History Forum Stockholm, Bildmuseet Umeå, Galerie Aedes Berlin, Sophiensæle Berlin, Frankfurter Positionen, Shanghai Spring Art Salon, Szamzie Space Seoul, Ars Electronica Festival, Centro de arte contemporánea Santiago de Compostela, and Gemäldegalerie am Kulturforum Berlin.

Andreas Hagelüken (*1963) studied musicology, philosophy, and art history. He has been involved in radio art and sound art at Sender Freies Berlin. He has produced numerous authorial works for radio stations in Germany and Europe, as well as projects for Goethe-Institutes in Mexico City, Shanghai, and Minsk. He is also associated with the free sound archive hoerspielbox.de. Additionally, he serves as a lecturer for Ars Acustica at the University of the Arts Berlin and the Karlsruhe University of Arts and Design. His collaboration with Christoph Viscorsum dates back to 2005, including the Audioweg-Gusen concept.
